

Wyoming Taskforce Meeting were the school's new facility, its state-licensed preschool, the great parent-student support, quality teaching and supporting staff as well as excellent church family support.

The school and church facility, built in 2018 on Timberline Street in Fort Collins, was designed with beautiful aesthetics and with safety in mind. The visiting team was impressed with the intentional plan of the building and appreciated the concentration on student and staff safety with its entrance door monitoring system, the number of cameras throughout the building, and regular emergency drills. Another plus is the location of the school in a great community next to the Fort Collins Police Services building.

The team commended the school for their new-this-year, state-licensed preschool for children (ages 3-6). Preschool director, Keiko Breese completed the state-licensed processes necessary to begin the preschool in August of last year, and put in place Jessica Reeder, a creative teacher for her preschool students.

The team noted that the desire to live and teach Christ-like behavior has had an impact, as seen in the parent and student surveys. Parents regarded the school as a safe place for their children, noted that the educational program was of high quality, and believed they were receiving value for their investment. In their surveys, students unanimously said their teachers cared about them, and they felt safe in their school. Half of the students who took the Iowa Test of Basic Achievement (ITBS) scored above 80-90 percent compared to the students of the same grade across the United States.

The visitation team was impressed with the warm, caring, and welcoming staff, which include Jessica Reeder, Dennis Breese, and Keiko Breese, all experienced, and talented teachers, who work together to provide the best environment for their students to thrive. The school also has knowledgeable and caring teacher's aides and volunteers from the church, including Daniel Birai, lead pastor of the Fort Collins Church, who provides a weekly Wednesday worship and teaches PE for grades 2-8 on Mondays and Wednesdays. The visiting team noted that the school has a stated imperative of increased spiritual opportunities for each student with active pastoral involvement and a variety of specific programs.

The accreditation visiting team was also impressed with the diversity of service opportunities for students, including the Bags of Love project, Women's Shelter project, and music performances at nursing homes. The team commended the school for the variety of co-curriculum activities offered including sewing, woodworking, after-school soccer practice, Pathfinders and Adventurer clubs. 
Countdown to Camp! » Young adults, passionate about camp ministry, will arrive in Boulder on June 2. After feasting on ice cream at Sweet Cow, they will make the trek up to Glacier View Ranch. It will be time to begin an intensive two-week preparation for this season's summer camps! A few days later, more than 60 young people will arrive, each one with a passion and talent to share at summer camp. Some will be cooking, some counseling, and others leading a variety of activities from arts and crafts to swimming, climbing, biking, and horseback riding.

As of May 24, camper reservations reached 520, down only 30 from the same time last year despite the fact that GVR is holding one fewer week of kids' camps to accommodate for a longer staff week. This change was made to increase staff preparedness and health as well as to fit in an increasing number of state-mandated employee trainings.

When the final preparations are made and campers begin to arrive with bright eyes and nervous anticipation on June 16, they'll move in to cabins, meet counselors, make friends and begin the experience of a lifetime. It will be their best summer ever, complete with notching arrows, saddling horses, making leather sandals, painting with boxing gloves, jumping off the deep end, and tipping canoes, all while learning to be at "home" with Jesus!

If you're on the fence about signing up for camp, be aware that the sessions are filling up fast. Cub Camp is completely full for girls and only has space for a few more boys. Junior Camp is nearing capacity as well. Additionally, camp directors are reminding everyone that reservations cannot be accepted within 10 days of each session's start dates, per a licensing requirement that went into affect last year. Out of Tragedy Comes Love

On April 12, » 2018 a terrible accident happened. Little Jude Wilson, less than a month away from his second birthday, was accidentally killed when his young mother, not realizing he was behind her car. struck Jude while she was

backing out of the driveway. He passed away on the way to

the hospital. As part of her ongoing healing process, Jude's grandmother, Lana Wilson is helping mothers in need. She and her husband Darrell Wilson turned that pain of loss into hope and the sharing of God's love.



They bought a brand new bassinet, along with swaddling blankets, diapers, non-toxic soaps, and many other items and presented this gift to a young mother who just a couple weeks away from having her first baby. To date this one bassinet has turned into 15 including two to a mother in Castle Rock who is expecting twins.

Lana recalls, "My entire family was down and very saddened but I felt that the Holy Spirit was really nudging me

to do this. I had the idea to do something like this for a long time prior to Jude's death, but our loss kicked me into action."

Jude's Bassinet is a ministry that not only helps Lana and mothers in need to provide a safe and comfortable environment for their newborn baby, but it also helps those who have been involved with the ministry. True Life Community Seventh-day Adventist Church members have raised money, offered numerous prayers, and donated items for the bassinets.

God has also opened doors for Lana to make presentations in other Seventh-day Adventist church congregations.

Lana is hoping to do the same in other churches. "We are looking for people who would like to help in a five different ways:

- Schedule a time before or after your worship service to have Lana and her team present Jude's Bassinet to your church family.
- 2. Donate items or money. Each fully loaded bassinet with all items cost more than \$300.
- 3. Pray for the ministry. Without prayers, Jude's Bassinet is just a distribution point. We want to be an influence for Jesus in the lives of expectant mothers in need.
- 4. Refer a mother in need. Most referrals come from the community at large. It makes no difference whether or not that mother-to-be attends any church at all.
- Be a Jude's Bassinet coordinator for your church community. As Jude's Bassinet expands, we will work with one person from each church family who like to coordinate JB events, make announcements, and more.

We want to create a network throughout churches, neighborhoods and cities that show the love of Jesus.

IN MEMORIAM

Don C. Schneider, former president of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in North America (NAD), passed away Thursday morning, May 23, 2019, in Texas, where he was living with Marti, his wife and partner in ministry. He was 76.

Schneider served as NAD president for 10 years. He was elected to the office in 2000 at the General Conference Session in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Prior to this, he served



as Lake Union Conference president for almost six years. "Don was a tremendous leader within the North American Division. We were blessed by his service in our Conference

as an administrator and pastor as he, and his wife Marti, served the Denver South congregation following his retirement from NAD in 2010," commented RMC president, Ed Barnett.

"Above all, he was known as a friend of Jesus. He was passionate to introduce Jesus to all, " he added.

The RMC office staff will remember him and Marti for leading a Reformation tour in Germany in 2013. The Schneiders served the Denver South congregation between August 2011 and March 2013.

Pastor Schneider's connection to the region included being president of the Wyoming Conference (before it became RMC) from July 1977 - July 1978. He then served as Rocky Mountain Conference president from June 1985 - May 1989.

Schneider's funeral service was held in Keene, Texas, on Tuesday, May 28. RMC was represented by Eric Nelson, VP for administration.

He is survived by Marti, daughter Carol, son Don Jr., and daughter-in-law Dorothy.
