Mapleton Avenue, the congregation invites the community to consider the church a destination where biblical scholarship is celebrated and shared. According to Japhet De Oliveira, senior pastor of the Boulder congregation, the lectureship series aims to become an annual gathering and "will include presentations from world-renowned experts in Old and New Testament Scriptures, all with the purpose of understanding more about how the God of the Bible is still at work in the shared story of humanity."

Open to the general public, the inaugural series, May 20-23, will be presented by Dr. Laurence Turner, a renowned Seventh-day Adventist Old Testament scholar and author. "Narratives, Imagination and Experiencing God -- Why the Bible Tells Stories" is the series theme.

For Japhet De Oliveira, an invitation extended to Dr. Turner to be the inaugural presenter for the Sanitas Lectureship was,

in part, an expression of deep appreciation of Turner's scholarship and deep theological thinking.

"As a professor and pastor, he brings your heart into the text and you will leave having a richer appreciation for who God is. The fear of the God from the First Testament will start to dissipate.

"What I have always loved about our Adventist tribe is our deep appreciation of the whole Bible and that we can see the character of God in both First and Second Testaments," De Oliveira explained.

"Laurence Turner is, for me, in the top three of biblical professors in the world, who are able to articulate such a rich vision of God through the stories of the First Testament. "I have heard from hundreds of pastors across the globe, that Laurence Turner has had the deepest positive impact in their approach to preaching from the First Testament than any other," he added. De Oliveira comments that "Dr. Turner's uniquely witty and insightful interpretations of Old Testament themes have made him a popular speaker for a wide variety of audiences around the world."

In the final day of the lectureship, May 23, Turner will address the ministers from the Boulder area, including pastors of Christian churches who are neighbors of the Adventist congregation in Boulder.

Craig Carr, ministerial director of the Rocky Mountain Conference, is "hoping that many of our Adventist pastors from up and down the Front Range will join us. My expectations of the event are high. With the expertise of professor and author, my hope is that all who attend would be further inspired to dive deeply into the narratives of the Old Testament, finding applicable truths for our time," Craig commented.

A noted Old Testament scholar, author, and international speaker, Dr. Laurence Turner holds graduate degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary and the University of Sheffield in England, and has taught at both Avondale College in Australia and Newbold College in England, where he most recently served as head of the Department of Theological Studies.

His books include Announcements of Plot in Genesis (1990) and Genesis Readings, A New Biblical Commentary (2000). He also co-edited "He Began with Moses . . ." Preaching the Old Testament Today (2010), which won Preaching Today's Book of the Year award in 2011.

ASI Mid-America Comes to Denver » If you're like me, you've heard of ASI for many years. You know the organization is made up of business people, its formal name being Adventist-laymen's Services and Industries, but you don't know much beyond that. Well, it's time we learned more because this group is on the go. They're dynamic and confirmed in their desire to see Jesus coming soon. The ASI Mid-America convention took place at the Denver Ramada Plaza Hotel in Broomfield from Thursday evening, April 21, through Sunday, April 24, starting with a keynote presentation by Steve Dickman, national ASI president. According to Barbara Taylor, Mid-America's ASI president, "Steve Dickman's message encouraged faithfulness in sharing the light with urgency so that no one will say, 'Why

didn't you tell me?" A handful of about 50 attendees swelled to around 400 for Sabbath services.

The family feel was evident when the Franktown church children's choir performed during the Sabbath morning service and later, when three young siblings from the Graybill family sang during the afternoon and evening seminars.

In his morning Sabbath School presentation, Gary Thurber, president of Mid-America Union





Conference spoke of the "ASI family," re-emphasizing our connectedness in Christ.

During the break for lunch, groups gathered in a central courtyard around tables, where they were served lunch, while others occupied individual rooms for large family groups who brought their own picnics.

The exhibit room opened after lunch for visitors to peruse the varied booths and discover the multitude of ministries operating in the territories of the Rocky Mountain Conference and beyond. Inspiration for service was plentiful. Among the displays were Feed My Lambs, The Peru Project, Binding Broken Hearts, Inc. and more.

Phillip Rego's life changed entirely in 2008 after seeing firsthand the despair in the faces of Haiti's people in the aftermath of the four storms that hit the island that year. Imprinted on his mind was the vision of people mixing mud, water and oil to make mud cakes to eat. "Walking away was not an option," Phillip stated. His response was the creation of Feed My Lambs Ministry (FMLM), his attempt to bring relief to the on-going plight of the Haitian people. Since 2008, the organization has invested in a health center, an academy and a water purification system.

The Peru Projects, Inc. is dedicated to taking the gospel to the jungle. They run an air program that transports mission personnel and does medical evacuations, a Bible worker program that trains and deploys lay Bible workers and provides financial and logistical support as well as ministerial materials, a jungle chapel construction team for new groups of believers, and a mission group host who gives logistical

Mills Spring Ranch Board support to volunteer mission groups doing evangelism, medical, dental or construction projects.

Eden Valley's Lifestyle Center offers help in conquering high blood pressure, heart disease, diabetes, obesity, allergies, arthritis and other chronic diseases. Their trained staff provides support for exercise, hydrotherapy, vegan meals, massage and hyperbaric treatments. Also associated with Eden Valley is Stones Valley Foundation in India, orphanages that teach children, many of whom come from the surrounding communities.

Binding Broken Hearts is a Wyoming non-profit prison ministry that has, so far, provided support to 10,689 inmates in 349 facilities in 34 states. Each inmate who makes contact with them receives a leather-bound Andrews Study Bible and monthly letters along with Bible studies. So far, they have sent out 8,014 Bibles and 77,549 letters with Bible studies. They dream of one day owning a working ranch where inmates can come, upon release, to work, to learn, and to heal.

Black Hills Health & Education Center has a wellness center, a school of massage and biblical response therapy, a coaching method and curriculum that leads students step by step through the process of applying a balance to the physical, mental and spiritual components of complete health.

"Our intention is to support what the church is doing rather than doing something separate," explained Steve Dickman. ASI, I learned, impacts the church locally, nationwide and worldwide through programs they've developed for lay people.

New Beginnings provides resources and tools for laypeople to use with evangelism -- in their own homes or in a church setting.

Pathway to Health, another ASI brainchild, provides full medical, surgical, vision and dental services for the public free of charge to patients. Volunteers with Pathway to Health spent three days in San Antonio just prior to the 2015 General Conference Session, treating 6,192 patients. Currently, volunteers are descending on Los Angeles with a \$1.1 million budget to provide free medical services.

ASI also has a project-funding cycle during which they receive applications from individuals and organizations until December 31 when applications close. Around, February or March, a committee looks at every application and chooses 30 to 40 projects to fund, contributing \$1-2 million toward these projects. March 26
