
As these coordinators return to their local churches, they will have opportunity to encourage others to join in this outreach.

Deep in the heart of the Amazon Basin a group of villagers are desperately seeking help. Their community faces numerous environmental problems that are contributing to a variety of health complications, among them: contaminated water, leading to parasites and chronic diarrhea; mosquitoborne diseases, like malaria and dengue fever; and food insecurity, which contributes to deficiencies in their diet that lead to illness and anemia.



Adding to this list, they face the challenge of isolation, mental health, sexually transmitted diseases, and teen pregnancies, all ripping at the fabric of these communities. They're desperate for change, but remoteness and lack of education have left local leaders unsure of how to help their villages.

They've turned to Global Health Initiatives for help...and hope.

In response, GHI is launching a new program called Salud Total or Total Health. This pioneering program is built upon ten years of regional medical missions and is designed to address the medical, environmental, and social determinates of health in a holistic manner. GHI is supporting this sustainability project by forming collaborative partnerships with the Ministry of Health, the local government, the Union University of Peru, TreanorHL, and GHI partner hospital, Clinica Adventista Ana Stahl.

Global Health Initiatives issued an invitation to partner with them in transforming an entire community in rural Peru. The construction of the building that will house medical students who will assess and improve the stability of the community's health is near completion. These students, 5th year nurses, nutrition, and psychology students from Union University of Peru, will move in for ten months in March. They'll have a roof over their heads, but right now, they're in need of furniture to make this new home livable.

Mensa Christian Education Center in Zambia

Graduates First Class » The first graduating class of Fondina Pandeli Secondary School in Mansa, Zambia, walked the aisle of the campus church January 27 to complete their secondary school journey. School founder, Dr. Pardon Mwansa, could only say, "Fantastic!" when asked to describe his emotions on that day.

The building of Mensa Christian Education Center began in 2014 during a mission trip sponsored by the Rocky Mountain Conference. The original plan included the secondary school, a primary school, dormitories, cafeteria, church and garden, all a part of the education center. The master plan includes a primary school, industrial arts school and, eventually, even a college.

Since that trip, the secondary classrooms and the girls' dormitory have been completed. The church, where the graduation ceremony was held, is complete but for the ceiling and bathrooms and was organized into an official church the weekend after graduation. The cafeteria and boys' dorm are waiting to be built as is the primary school.

Some members of the graduating class were part of the original 13 students who began studying at the secondary school when it was first opened in Dr. Mwansa's private home in 2014.

With the new hand-dug borehole providing a sufficient water supply, the garden is flourishing. Ninety orange trees have taken root in the orchard nearby and the school is able to feed their students from their own healthy vegetables.

Funds for this project come in through people who are inspired to give, who hear about the need by word of mouth, through presentations given at churches, email updates and articles like this one.

One young student, a member of the graduating class, struggled with the school's rules and was suspended twice, yet he saw Jesus' love in the faculty who fought for him, and he was changed, even requesting baptism. Although his parents were doubtful about true change, they were thrilled as they saw him becoming a responsible, respectful child of God.

Campion Academy senior, Rayne Williams, a member of the 2016 mission trip team, recently talked about her experience there. "I think of Africa every day," she said, "and I am going back with the 2018 mission trip."
