series beginning January 5, 2018. In attendance were many of the people who are following up on Bible study cards returned from a series of mailings by the Voice of Prophecy. They came for training as well as a spiritual booster shot and many expressed their appreciation of the event.



In the school gymnasium with people sitting at round tables covered with an array of bright colors, Shawn Boonstra, VOP director and speaker for the Revelation Speaks Peace series coming in January, was on hand to provide encouragement and impetus for the work to be done between now and touchdown, sharing many stories of God's leading in His work. "God works ahead of us," he said, giving the example of cultures who already have a background for the gospel through their own stories of Creation and the Flood.

Boonstra also told his grocery-shopping story as an example of God working ahead. To make sure he was getting exactly what his wife wanted, he was talking to her by phone as he shopped. A woman in the store responded to him, thinking he was talking to her. Telling his wife he'd call her back, he hung up and then apologized to the woman for his "rudeness."

"As long as I'm talking to you," she laughed, "you might as well look at our specials," and she pointed to a selection of meats.

"Thank you, but I'm a vegetarian," he explained.

"I used to be a vegetarian," the woman stated, "but now I'm a meat-eater. We used to eat a lot of Special K Loaf."

"Busted!" Shawn said. "I'm a Seventh-day Adventist minister and you need to come back."

The woman began to cry, explaining she had been thinking she should come back, but didn't know how.

Sabbath morning, Boonstra read aloud Ellen White's dream (found in *Gospel Workers*, p. 136) about gathering the fruit, an analogy, of course, for soul-winning, pointing out the many parallels between the dream and church workers today.

Attendees were well-fed in the afternoon with an offering of seven workshops from which they could choose two. They






